
Day 2: Aug. 27, 2024



उदयपुर। विश्व जल दिवस सप्ताह के अंतर्गत आज पदमपत सिंघानिया यूनिवर्सिटी के सभागार में वरिष्ठ जल मित्र ने भविष्य की पीढ़ियों को जल उपलब्ध करने के लिए तीन "ब" के उपयोग का आह्वान किया। उन्होंने समझाया कि "बचाना" - दिनभर पानी को बचत करें और ऐसे साबुन, डिटजेंट या शैंपू का उपयोग न करें, जिससे पानी बर्बाद हो और न ही उसे पौधों या जानवरों के लिए इस्तेमाल किया जा सके। "बर्बाद न करना" - जल का विवेकपूर्ण उपयोग करें, ताकि उसका दुरुपयोग न हो। "बढ़ाना" - वर्षा के जल को हैंडपंप, ट्यूबवेल, कुएं या बावड़ी में संरक्षित करके भूमिगत जल स्तर को बढ़ाएं। उन्होंने कहा कि इन तीन



उपायों का पालन करके ही जल का संरक्षण संभव है। कार्यक्रम की शुरुआत जल संरक्षण पर केंद्रित गीत "पानी रे पानी तेरा रंग कैसा" से हुई, जिसने सभी का ध्यान जल संकट की ओर आकर्षित किया। अपनी प्रस्तुति में उन्होंने बताया कि भूमिगत जल का 11' पबतशत ,

800 मीटर की गहराई तक और 11त उससे भी नीचे उपलब्ध है, यानी कुल 22त। झीलों, नदियों और तालाबों में केवल 1त जल उपलब्ध है, जबकि शेष 77 प्रतिशत जल ग्लेशियरों में संग्रहीत है, जो ग्लोबल वार्मिंग के कारण धीरे-धीरे समाप्त हो रहा है। विशेष रूप से राजस्थान

में अति दोहन के कारण भूमिगत जल संकट गंभीर होता जा रहा है। उन्होंने विशेष रूप से ध्यान दिलाया कि इनती महीनों में रूफटॉप रेनवाटर हार्वेस्टिंग और सरफेस रेनवाटर हार्वेस्टिंग की योजना बना लेनी चाहिए, ताकि वर्षा का जल भूमि जल में समाहित हो सके। वर्तमान में हम केवल 6-8त जल ही संचित कर पा रहे हैं, जिसे बढ़ाए बिना जल संरक्षण और भविष्य की जल सुरक्षा असंभव होगा। डॉ. पी.सी. जैन ने देवास वाटर फिल्टर तकनीक के बारे में विस्तार से जानकारी दी। यह वर्षा जल को भूमिगत जल में मिलाने की एक सस्ती, सरल और न्यूनतम रखरखाव वाली तकनीक है। कार्यक्रम के अंत में "कुएं का जल आरती" श्लोक जय जलदेव हरे" के साथ संपन्न हुआ, जिसमें

छात्राओं ने पूजन किया। कार्यक्रम का संयोजन डॉ. मनीष दाधीच (नेशनल सर्विस स्कोम) और डॉ. तुलिका चक्रवर्ती ने किया, जबकि डॉ. पी.सी. जैन का धन्यवाद डॉ. तुलिका चक्रवर्ती ने किया। इस अवसर पर लेफ्टिनेंट डॉ. डी. एस. चौहान (डिप्टी डीन, स्टूडेंट वेलफेयर) भी उपस्थित थे। अंत में, आयोजकों ने माननीय कुलपति प्रो. डॉ. पृथ्वी यादव, कैम्पस निदेशक लेफ्टिनेंट कर्नल नीरज कुमार, प्रो. डॉ. प्रसून चक्रवर्ती डीन रिसर्च, प्रमुख प्रशासनिक अधिकारी श्री सुनील पांडेय, डीन, उप-डीन, सकाफ सदस्यों, एनएसएस स्वयंसेवकों/छात्रों को अभिपान में उनके समर्थन और सहभागिता के लिए हार्दिक धन्यवाद दिया।
